workshops

Workshops take place on **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays from 14:30** and are divided by topic and language skill. Some are in English or in Czech with interpreting. You can study linguistics, learn more about Prague, history, film and literature, or you can cook.



walks

Tours in city streets are in the programme because I think that seeing and experiencing Prague is an important part of the LŠSS. Tours are for smaller groups of students in workshops; more tours (in Czech and English) are planned for Monday evenings. Pick whatever interests you.



trips

On Wednesdays, we'll visit Prague's sights and museums. Each trip is available in both Czech and English. This year,. you'll learn more about Charles IV and the Emauzy monastery, Czech literature and Franz Kafka in the Museum of Literature and Czech history from the top of Vítkov Hill.



evening programme

On Monday, we'll go on tours to let you experience the city in the evening. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we'll have various informal events at the ISC Hub on -1 floor at the Masarykova dormitory. The other evenings are for relaxation or homework - I hear that Fridays are considered the ideal time for homework ;-)



day trips

- Day trips are on Saturdays - we leave at 8:30 and return around 17:00
- The Sunday trips are shorter so you can get in a good night's sleep
- The weekend of 3 and 4 August is free. And though you may not feel that way yet, I know you'll need it. Enjoy :-)
- We'll go by bus (a slightly more modern one than in the picture) to Kutná Hora, the Svijany brewery and Český ráj
- By train, we'll visit Nelahozeves and Pardubice
- In Prague, we'll explore Divoká Šárka and Košíře, a less known part of the city
